Dear Parents and Carers,

We were due to send our next newsletter after half term but there are some important updates below.

As you will be aware, positive cases of coronavirus are increasing and some parts of the country are facing tougher restrictions. While we are not facing further local restrictions, we do want to keep our school open to all children and keep our school community safe and well. With this in mind, I must remind all parents to ensure they are following all government guidelines including only meeting in groups of six, maintaining social distance and washing your hands regularly.

***Should your children or anyone in your family develop symptoms and require a test, please let the school know as soon as possible via email. This information will be kept confidential and the school office email account will be regularly monitored throughout half term.***

The children will not have homework over the half term break other than keeping up with their reading. They need time to enjoy their break after such a busy return to school. We have been so impressed with their positive approach to their learning, which we know will continue when they return to school refreshed and ready on Tuesday 3<sup>rd</sup> November.

### **Remembrance Sunday**

The children have created their own poppies which will be displayed on the front fence to commemorate Remembrance Sunday and we will be sharing a service in school. The children are asked to bring in a gold coin donation on Friday 6<sup>th</sup> November in support of the Royal British Legion Poppy Appeal. We will not be able to collect donations throughout the week and request that the children bring the coin in themselves on Friday 6<sup>th</sup> November.

### **Collection Times**

A polite reminder that Beech and Oak collection time is 3:15pm and KS2 classes are collected at 3:25pm. Parents are expected to share this information with grandparents, other family members or child carers who may be collecting the children from school.

### **Mobile Phones**
